

ONC Special Program January 12

Presented by Frank and Joyce Burek, Texas Underwater Photo Society

Joyce and Frank Burek are wildlife photographers whose specialty is marine subjects. Photographing nature together for 40 years, they began recording and documenting the underwater environment after being diving certified in 1980. Since then, they have logged over 2,000 photographic dives and shot over 4,000 rolls of film. Their slide library has over 100,000 images in it, their digital library over 25,000. Originally photographing with Nikonos and housed film systems, they now shoot digital with Fuji S-2 camera systems and dual Ikelite A-100 strobes.

The Bureks will be presenting two digital programs at our January meeting. The first is "The Flower Garden's — A Taste of Texas." The program explores the marine life of Stetson Bank, East and West Bank of the Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary (FGBNMS) and the oil platform located within the sanctuary. The second program is "Two Different Worlds." With "Two Different Worlds" the Bureks explore our natural world. This scenic trip highlights the wonders of nature above and below the waves by comparing these two different areas of our planet. From the mountains to the prairies, from the forests to the deserts, from the streams to the oceans, from Lions to Lionfish the adventure continues.

Their photos have appeared in aquariums, calendars, brochures, books, magazines, newspapers and posters with numerous publishers including Audubon Society, National Geographic Society and the National Wildlife Federation. In 2000 NOAA recognized them for their photographic documentation of the FGBNMS with the Environmental Hero Award. Their work is featured in the current FGBNMS brochure and website.





The Bureks are authors and publishers of three computer based marine identification CD-ROM products. Covering both marine plants and animals, each contains a marine identification guide plus pictures that can be viewed as a custom slide show.

- The Marine Life of the Flower Garden Banks NMS sells for \$20 and has over 420 images of 350 species. Unique photographs include the golden phase of the Spotted Trunkfish, Unicorn Filefish, Goldfaced Toby (a deep water puffer identified in 2003) and the beautiful Mardi Gras Wrasse (a fish new to science, discovered through the Bureks photographs discovery paper to be released in 2006).
- The Marine Life of the Bay Islands of Honduras sells for \$30 and has 800 images of over 700 species. Species on this CD cover most of those found in the Caribbean. Unique photographs include the Filament Blenny and a Nudibranch presently unknown to science.
- *The Marine Life of Indonesia* sells for \$35, has over 1,450 images of over 1,100 species. Species on this CD cover many of those found in the Western Pacific. Photographs that make this CD of great interest are the Pygmy Seahorses, Crocodilefish, Clownfish, colorful nudibranchs and living shells.

Mark your calendars; you won't want to miss this beautiful program.
